## Recognize the KGEU NOW!!!

PSI represents more than 20 million public sector workers around the world. We strongly support the Korean Government Employees' Union and their demand for recognition, and the numerous actions that they have organized in the last years. At the International Labour Conference, PSI spoke out on the violations of trade union rights in Korea – both at the Committee on the Application of Standards and in other committees.

Our Korean affiliates are receiving daily support from fellow trade unionists in countries that include Korea's main trade partners: Japan, Australia, the United States, the European Union and elsewhere.

We know that more intense negotiations between your government and the KGEU have been taking place in recent weeks, and applaud the progress that has been made. However, we are appalled that at the last minute – once again – you fail to honour the commitments made. Until today – the KGEU has not been recognized.

We urge your government to respect the recommendations of the ILO, to legalize the KGEU, normalize social dialogue, ensure freedom of association and to stop abusing the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour and the Ministry of Security and Public Administration. As a member of the OECD, Korea is also bound to respect international labour standards.

Recognition is but a first step that will lead to real social dialogue for government employees in Korea. Do not linger any longer and recognize the KGEU without further delay.

The public at large is aware of the disgraceful treatment of trade unionists in your country, the lack of respect for international standards and how hundreds of workers lose their jobs because they choose to exercise their rights and belong to unions.

This campaign will continue until workers' rights are respected in Korea. The world is watching. We look forward to you and your government responding positively to this call for immediate fair treatment and recognition of union workers.
