OBJECTIVES

1. To reach out to young people in a format that engages and interests them
2. To show them that unions and the PSI are not only a vehicle for positive change, but also somewhere they can get leadership experience and training that is hard to come by in the workplace
3. To build accountability, responsibility, and participation in APYN and PSI as a whole by asking youth what they see as key priorities and using these to direct the network
4. To identify potential “superstars” and future leaders to make APYN and PSI sustainable into the future
5. To give them an example of this working in the real world through the Japanese youth
6. To develop and propose recommendation to the APREC Meeting
