



ULATOC 10 YEARS, BALANCE AND PROPOSALS

ULATOC ANTECEDENTS

The Latin American Union of Workers of Control Organizations -ULATOC- is an International Federation of Unions constituted by organizations of national governmental workers, Latin American national, regional and local government agencies whose task is to audit and / or the comptroller of public finances and processes, and government systems and the results of policies and programs structures. The Union also accepts membership of employee organizations of workers of hacendal control organisms of international institutions, constituted by Member States or governmental authorities.

As an international trade union organization, is based on the principle of solidarity between workers of control agencies and public sector auditing in Latin America. Encourages dialogue, concentration and international cooperation as a means of solving regional and global problems. Promotes economic development based on the principles of social justice and sustainability, promotes peace and environmental protection at regional and national level. ULATOC was established in Buenos Aires in March 2004 per pulse of its current General Secretary and also General Secretary of Association of Staff of Control Organisms from Republic Argentina (APOC), Dr. Hugo Buisel Quintana with the accompaniment of Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Paraguay and Uruguay Organizations. From there he has sought to extend his membership, having been extended the network of countries and organizations of America, Africa and Europe.

To date ULATOC remains relations with 14 countries, four Organizations of Civil Society, 11 Control Organisms and 20 organizations and unions.

In our declaration of beginnings we hold up that our peoples need right tools to optimize the public management and definitively eradicate the corruption and we consider that our peoples urgently demand a look that shows the actions and results of their governors and these require a permanent guide to efficiently manage the always limited public resources.

We postulate that the responsibilities of the external and internal control in public institutions, in the budgetary issues, legality, operational and management should relate only to Public Control Organisms. There should be no any investment of public resources that is outside its sphere of comptroller as it is these who have the necessary independence and institutional mission of control. We are convinced that governments in the region should take legal and administrative measures to ensure that multilateral assistance they receive is monitored by his superiors Control Entities. We cannot fail to evoke numerous fraudulent collusion of private auditing with the events in recent times shook finance from developed countries jeopardizing sources of jobs.

We aim to arrive at a consensus that a unified approach that defines the philosophy and spirit of commitment control with State Policies planned and sustainable and no of political parties of the incumbent government. Similar reflection fit for Supranational Entities.

Despite its relatively recent creation ULATOC has deployed an intense and varied drive both regionally and internationally as well as in strengthening relations with sister organizations in Spain, Italy, Portugal, France, Belgium, Canada, United States and Luxembourg, as well as with institutions such as the Parliament of MERCOSUR and the Court of Auditors of the European Union.

In its first decade of life ULATOC has participated and formally recognized at the International Labor Conference of the International Labor Organization in Geneva, Switzerland, where it takes an active role in defending workers of the Public Control impulse even draft rules and recommendations for the work protection of the Public Control worker.



Through the Association of Staff of Control Organizations (APOC) with 50 years of existence in the Argentina Republic, the ULATOC is affiliated with the Public Services International (PSI) and since 2010 have driven the Sector Public Control PSI highlighting the importance of creating and leading a own sector to interpret the particular demands of control workers. This successful partnership between ULATOC and PSI has produced outstanding activities together and currently valuing the importance of Control organisms and their impact on improved governance, the strengthening of the institutions of the Republic, the transparency and fight against corruption, examples are the meetings held at the World Congress to be held in South Africa in the city of Durban on November 26, 2012, the forum against corruption in the International Labor Organization in June 2013, among others. Also at the regional level integrated the Coordinator of Central Unions Southern Cone (CCSCS) consists of 13 unions confederations where - at the same end - coordinated the Public Control Committee.

Thus we move towards finding an integration space with other union's sisters, to share the experiences of the countries compared, and defend the legitimate business interests of control union's workers from union solidarity, perform activities of training and exchange, and boost the ranking of institutions of Control and defend decent work and quality public services.

With this philosophy and commitment from the founding act of ULATOC, we noted the need for the creation of a Control Organism with competence in the MERCOSUR ambit and in that sense we have sent our submissions to the Mercosur Parliament as soon as this was constituted then basing them on several occasions.

In 2008 we signed a technical assistance agreement with the MERCOSUR Parliament for the purposes of participating in the regional integration process assisting the development of a control system that gives transparency and efficiency.

We highlight the recent achievement of ULATOC obtained in the last plenary meeting of the Economic and Social Consultative Forum of MERCOSUR held in the City of Rio de Janeiro on September 12 where it was unanimously approved the Recommendation N° 3/12 FCES approving the formation of a technical team for the impulse charge of a Body Control of the MERCOSUR. This is how we have conceived international trade union work as a means to defend on a daily basis the rights of workers in the Public Control.

OBJECTIVES ULATOC

In alignment to regional and global strategies and in accordance with the statutes in effect, ULATOC set the following objectives:

- Increase the capacity of unionization and unions representation
- Promote and defend the Independence of public sector institutions to guarantee the Social State of Law principles.
- Defend, promote and divulge the rights and internationally fundamental principles recognized in the Conventions, Recommendations and Resolutions of the ILO that contribute to the welfare of workers and their organizations.
- Sensitize of the state actors and civil society on the importance of the control organisms and their functions.
- Contribute to the recognition of the role of public servants.
- Promote the exercise of the Public Control by its tools to provide quality public services.
- Encourage labor capacitation activities and interchange for professional training
- Promote transparency and ethics in the management of public funds and the exercise of public function.
- Encourage the Social Union Commitment.



- Develop activities that promote strengthening, recovery and visualization of Public Control as a basis for Social State of Law.
- Participate in the national process and the regional integration of the nations and workers who defend the labor beginnings, unions and the tools and institutional roles of Control as a democracies strengthening.

- Promotion and Development Union Balance

Promote the inclusion in the Corporate Business and societies Balance a union report where the degree of compliance with national and international norms on decent working conditions are reflected, exposing in range of corporate social responsibility and the degree of labor and trade union behavior respect.

- Tracking and monitoring labor and trade union incumbencies to International and Regional Credit

Organisms. Commercial Agreements, International Double Standards.

Bringing the voice and increase participation and attendance at national, regional and international stages to respect and preserve the labor and trade union rights, eliminate the existence of double standards in policy all international credit operations and trade agreements.
